He is joining the military to serve our wonderful country and provide for his new family.

After arriving at our home, she was informed that she would have to turn herself in. After spending a night in jail, she was released to us on probation. She feels a great sense of relief not having to hide anymore.

After learning more about Kymerly and her past, we encouraged her to enroll in Intensive Outpatient Rehab program to work on staying sober. There she also attends weekly parenting classes. She has two wonderful children and working towards becoming the best mother possible.

We are proud to announce she chose to have an open adoption! She wants her baby girl to have the best opportunities in life, therefore, she has chosen a wonderful Louisiana couple to be blessed with the opportunity to raise her daughter. She is due to give birth in June.

April came to us with her three year old daughter. She will give birth to her second daughter in September. She also had an active warrant and had to turn her-self in. We were able to get her out the same day and a court date was set in June. In the mean-time, April is working her GED and enrolling her daughter into the Lafayette Parish School system. She is also in parenting classes learning how to be a better mother. We are proud of the hard work and effort she is doing to better herself..

Abby was referred to us by Dept. of Children & Family Services (DCFS). She suffers with an addiction. She delivered a beautiful boy who has been in NICU. In desperate need of help, she was admitted into Inpatient Rehab which she has completed. Now, she is enrolled in Intensive Outpatient Rehab, attends NA/AA meetings and in parenting classes.
